

Working in Europe to Connect Talent Development in Higher Education



How can we join forces around Europe to develop tools that can help teachers spot and stimulate talented students? That is the aim in the project 'Working in Europe to Connect talent Development in Higher Education', which brings together nine organisations from six countries. The project partners held their first meeting at Hanze University of Applied Sciences in Groningen in October, further detailing their

plans to be worked out in the coming three years. The project receives EU funding under the Strategic Partnerships program within Erasmus+ Key Action 2. The European Honors Council is associate partner in this project.

University of Antwerp starts honours program for last-year students secondary education

From the academic year 2018-2019, last year students of secondary education in Belgium will be able to follow an honours course at the University of Antwerp.
