Talent education conference in Slovenia, October 2019

The Conference Talent Education 2019 – "Everybody counts" will be held on 24th - 26th October 2019 in Portorož, Slovenia. It is organized by MIB - International Education Center and ITEI - International Talent Education Institute. Abstract submission is open until April 30. The main topic of the conference is practically oriented: how can we transfer theoretical starting points in practice, how practice dictates development of science, practical strategies, working with gifted and talented children, adolescents and young adults. Entire conference will be oriented to didactic and counseling strategies.
