EHC partner in two grant applications

Over the last few months, the Board of the EHC has devoted a lot of time to the preparation of two grant applications in the EU's Erasmus+ Program. Both applications aim to further strengthen talent development programs in European higher education, but they do so in different ways. One application is focused on policy makers, while the other focuses on teachers and students. In both applications the EHC is involved as an associate partner. Funding decisions are expected in the summer.
