Copenhagen Honours College receives funding

Good news from Denmark: University College Copenhagen has received a five-year grant to build the Copenhagen Honours College. The funding of approx. 4 million euros comes from the Novo Nordisk Foundation. The new Honours College is firstly aimed at students in science teacher education and will consist of a 30 ECTS program running over two years. The idea is also to spread 'honours' to more fields of study within the institution over the coming years. University College Copenhagen is the largest university of applied sciences in Denmark, with around 20,000 students. A full press release (in Danish) can be found [here](#)

Dissertation on global citizenship and honors education

'Ethical sensitivity and developing global civic engagement in undergraduate honors students'. On 14 February, Ingrid Schutte publicly defended her dissertation with this title in Utrecht, the Netherlands. In her thesis, Schutte aims to contribute empirical knowledge concerning honors education in the moral and civic area. She examines ethical sensitivity and investigates how education can foster moral and civic development of students, preparing them for their role as engaged global citizens. Schutte is a researcher at Hanze University of Applied Sciences (UAS) and received her Ph.D. from the University of Humanistic Studies. Her thesis (in English) can be found in open access [here](#).
