'Honors education in the digital age': Call for contributions special issue JEHC

The Journal of the European Honors Council (JEHC) invites submissions to Volume 4 Number 1 (2020) for inclusion in a special issue on Honors Education in the Digital Age.

With technology taking an ever-more dominant role in the university classrooms, this special issue aims to provide a forum for researchers and practitioners to reassess and re-conceptualize the role of honors and talent development programs in the Digital Age.

Prospective contributors are encouraged to think boldly and propose ideas for how to conceptualize honors education in the twenty-first century. The goal of the issue is to:

- 1) draw attention to how emerging technology is changing the landscape of education, and changing the way we live and work, which requires a different skill set, and to
- 2) present new theoretical ideas that will inspire future research.

Contributions may include original research papers and brief reports in the form of 'notes'.
